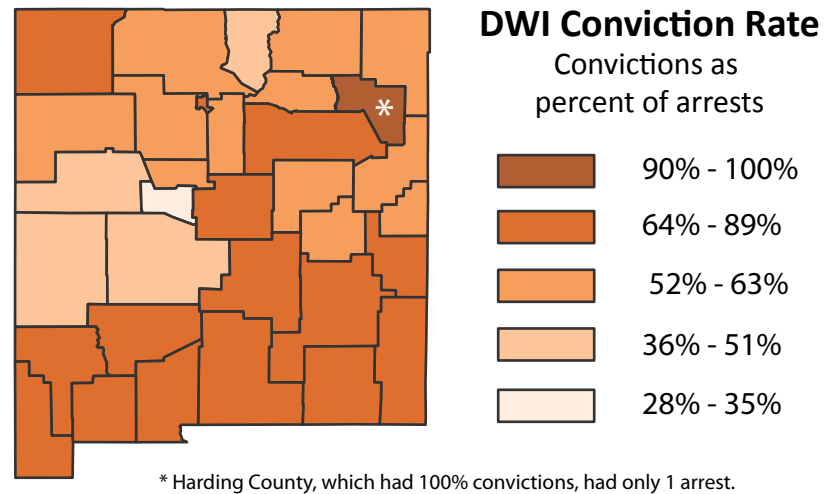
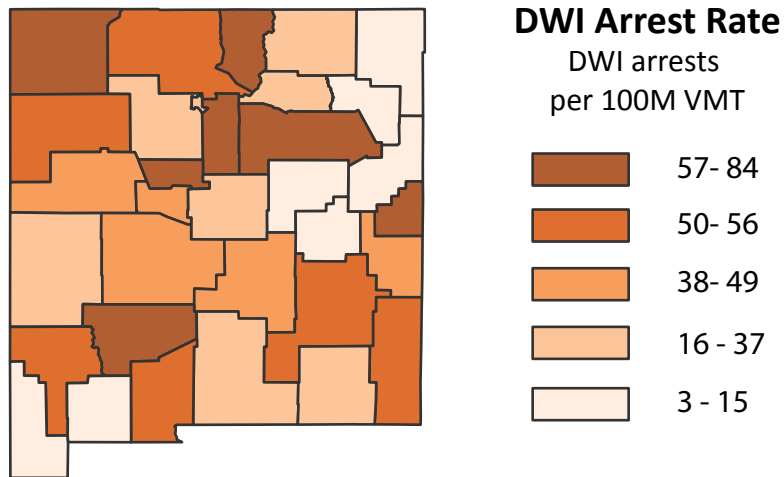
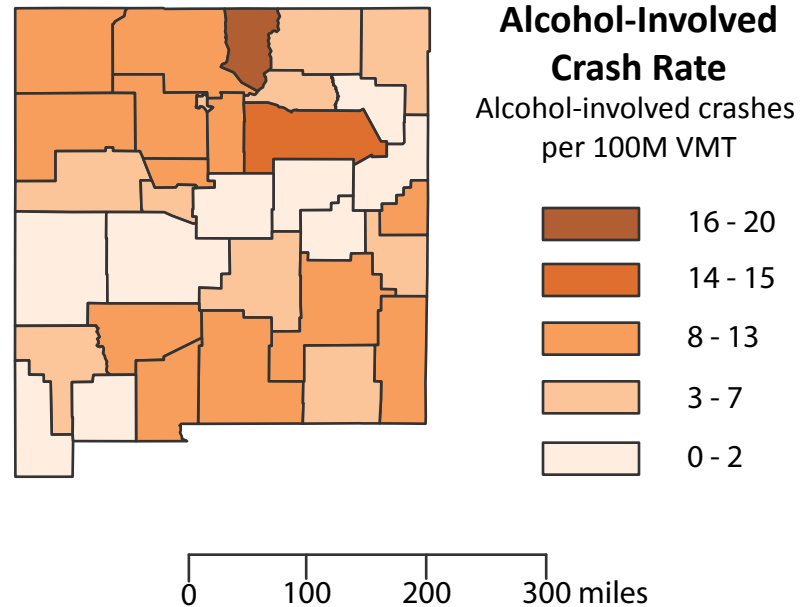


Drunk Driving and Enforcement in N.M. Counties, 2011

Alcohol-involved crashes are those in which: 1) a DWI citation was issued, 2) alcohol involvement contributed to the crash, or 3) a pedestrian or a person in control of a vehicle (including cyclists) was suspected of being under the influence of alcohol.

"100M VMT" stands for "100 million vehicle miles traveled."

Convictions are as of July 2012.
